

From Earth to Sky is a public art installation for Airdrie's Multi-Use Facility & Library, symbolizing the bond between Mother Earth and Father Sky and honoring the seven Treaty 7 First Nations: Siksika, Kainai, Piikani, Tsuut'ina, and the three Stoney Nakoda Nations—Bears paw, Chiniki, and Goodstoney. Celebrating Airdrie's Indigenous heritage, the sculpture's red poles represent strength and energy, while black pictographs honor each of the Treaty 7 tribes.

The tipi form and symbols emphasize resilience, unity, and values like respect, humility, and kinship, making this work a meaningful reflection of Airdrie's diverse and interconnected community.
